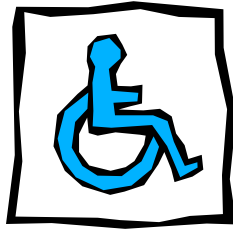


ACCESSIBILITY INFORMATION

Access information for our Guests with a disability and/or Guests in wheelchairs.



WELCOME!

Welcome to the Rides and Attractions of the San Diego Coaster Company. Over the years, we have made and continue to make modifications designed to provide greater access for all Guests.

We invite comments and suggestions you might have regarding improving our park and improving access to our facilities. We also welcome any comments you might have about your personal experience at our park.

RIDE SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

Guests may ride our rides and attractions by complying with the following general policy rules.

All Guests must be able to sit in the seat with the Restraint System engaged as designed.

No Guest may compromise the safety or welfare of other Guests or Employees.

All Guests must be able to evacuate themselves using catwalks, ladders and/or stairs.

All Guests are responsible for getting themselves on and off rides. Ride Operators are not allowed to physically assist Guests onto rides.

Ride Safety Requirements are posted on each ride's Fun and Safety Sign at the entrance to the ride. All Guests must conform to these safety requirements. Ride Operators enforce the height requirements and other rules posted on these signs.

Most rides have restraint systems designed to accommodate an "average" person, therefore extremely large or small individuals and Guests with casts or braces may not be properly seated or restrained. We will only restrict access if we feel safety may be compromised. Height restrictions may not be changed or waived under any conditions.

If you have questions regarding our ride safety requirements please read the Fun and Safety Sign at the ride's entrance, ask our Ride Operators or ask to speak to the Manager on Duty. The Manager on Duty has final authority on all ride access issues.

BEFORE YOU RIDE

All Guests who are interested in riding our rides and attraction are encouraged to watch each ride through its loading, running, and unloading cycle to understand the operation of the ride.

You may also ask to speak to the Manager on Duty. The Manager on Duty can explain the conditions and dynamics of each ride.

This procedure allows you to gather information about the rides and help you make an informed evaluation to determine which rides to visit.

RIDE AND ATTRACTION ACCESSIBILITY

Guests with a disability may access rides through the entrance or exit. Exits wide enough for a wheelchair are located at most rides. (See “Access for Guests in Wheelchairs”, for specific information.)

Discuss transfer options for all rides with the Manager on Duty, who can be contacted in the Roller Coaster Museum.

Our Ride Operators are always happy to take a few extra minutes to ensure that you and your party are quickly and safely helped.

ACCESS FOR GUESTS IN WHEELCHAIRS

The following ride should be approached through the side entrance. Use the wheelchair ramp located on the left side of the Roller Coaster Museum. Go around the Liberty Carousel and you will see a side entrance to the left of the main entrance of the Roller Coaster. Please use wheelchair lift and wait at top gate until ride operator gives access to ride platform. If you are with a group, have additional members wait in the main entrance line. Inform the ride operator of the situation and they will do their best to reunite the group at the correct time.

Access at Side Entrance: Giant Dipper Roller Coaster

If you have a disability that prevents you from waiting in an entrance line, the following rides are best approached through the exit gate. When you arrive at one of these rides notify the Ride Operator. You may then wait with your party at the ride’s exit for the same amount of time as the Guests waiting in line. The Ride Operator will let you know how long the wait will be. If you are with a group larger than four, have additional members wait in the entrance line. Inform the Ride Operator of the situation and they will do their best to reunite the group at the correct time.

Access at Exit: Vertical Plunge, Liberty Carousel, Thunder Boats, Krazy Kars, Chaos,

Beach Blaster, Speedway Bumper Cars

Due to the nature of the following rides, Guests with a disability may find accessibility difficult.

Tilt-A-Whirl, Crazy Submarine

Wheelchair access is very difficult via the ride’s entrance or exit. Guest’s must negotiate 2-3 stairs to enter and 2-3 stairs to exit

PARKING

Parking is provided for vehicles displaying a handicapped placard or license plate. These parking spaces are along the front row of the North Parking Lot (by the exit to the Giant Dipper), as well as in the East and South Parking Lots.

RESTROOMS

Wheelchair accessible restrooms are located along Carousel way.

STORES AND RESTAURANTS

If you are a Guest with a special need please ask for assistance from an Employee in our stores and restaurants. Our staff will be happy to provide assistance, such as reading menus, taking orders or browsing merchandise.

GUIDE, SIGNAL AND SERVICE ANIMALS

Guide dogs assist individuals who are visually impaired with mobility, signal dogs assist the Deaf and hearing-impaired with sound awareness, and service dogs assist persons with a disability.

California Civil Code Sections 54.1 and 54.2 grant people accompanied by guide, signal and service dogs full and equal access to all public facilities, including restaurants, hotels, shopping centers and amusement parks.

The Americans with Disabilities Act-Title 1.1 Section 36.302 states that the term service animal encompasses any guide dog, signal dog, or other animal individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including but not limited to, guiding individuals with impaired vision, alerting individuals with impaired hearing to intruders or sounds providing minimal protection or rescue work, pulling a wheelchair or fetching dropped items.

These are the only animals allowed in Belmont Park or on the Boardwalk.

No animals are allowed on any of the rides.

SPECIAL NEEDS
